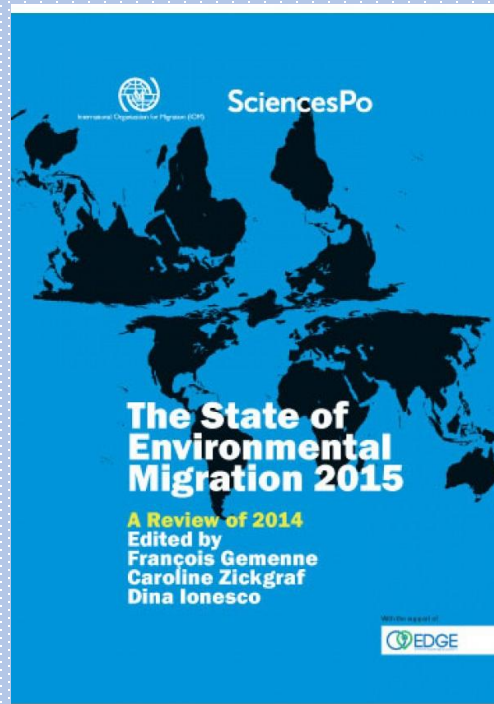

The book "**The State of Environmental Migration 2015 - A Review of 2014**" was most likely published in 2015. On Dec 1, 2015, Caroline Zickgraf and others published The State of Environmental Migration 2015: A Review of 2014. This book contains 228 related pages about "The State of Environmental Migration 2015 - A Review of 2014".

The State of Environmental Migration 2015: Review of the Year 2014 is the fifth of the annual publications aiming to enhance understanding of natural disasters, sudden natural onset events, and slow onset events, and their links to human mobility. The publication is not only focused on 2014 events but also considers the longer-term impacts of a natural occurrence on

migration, as they can be assessed with the state of knowledge existing in 2014. It also reviews the developments at the policy level relating to migration, climate, and the environment. Written in collaboration with students enrolled in the environment and migration course at the Paris School of International Affairs (PSIA) of Sciences Po, this report examines the issue of environmental migration, by analyzing case studies selected by students.

The State of Environmental Migration 2015 is a comprehensive report that provides an overview of the causes and consequences of environmental migration, including climate change, natural disasters, and environmental degradation. The book explores the legal and policy frameworks that govern environmental migration, as well as the challenges and opportunities that arise from this complex issue. It includes case studies from different regions of the world, highlighting the experiences of communities that have been affected by environmental migration. This book is a valuable resource for policymakers, academics, and anyone interested in understanding the complex relationship between environmental change and human mobility.

The widespread severe flooding and landslides in May 2014 certainly could not have been avoided, but it was possible to anticipate their occurrence, to prepare for such an event, and to limit the damage. These events starkly shed light on the fact that socially vulnerable populations were living in flood-prone zones and were less resilient to such events. Evacuation

was poorly managed and longer-term consequences of displacement were not tackled effectively. The following is a list of lessons learned and recommendations to reduce Bosnians' exposure to disasters.
